For students who were accepted into a school of their choice, it is imperative that you register at your school on **Saturday, February 6<sup>th</sup>**. At registration, you will not only assure yourself of a spot in their graduating class of 2014, but you will also be informed of a variety of scholarship and financial aid opportunities. Please see Mr. Silver for assistance with all financial aid applications and requests. Once you are registered at your school of choice, you can be confident that you will be challenged, satisfied, and motivated during your high school experience. Registering at your high school is of the utmost importance, not only because you will solidify your high school placement for 2010-2011, but also because it will help relieve much of the pressures of the high school placement process.

For those of you who were not accepted into a parochial school of your choice, or for those of you who were placed on the Waiting List at a school, be sure to arrange for an interview as soon as possible, in order to increase your chances of acceptance. All of you are skilled at interviewing, as you have developed confidence and self-awareness that will enable you to impress and understand the admissions officers you will meet. And as always, continue to do your very best in all of your classes, while living the Core Values, as many high schools will re-evaluate your applications based on your improved academics and behavioral standing in hopes of accepting you into their schools in the upcoming weeks.

Many students have also recently tested at area Magnet, Vocational, and Charter Schools, or have applied and interviewed at prestigious Private Day Schools and Boarding Schools. Congratulations on your diligence and attention to detail as you await the results of the schools' decisions.
